## CHANDRAJIT P. RAUT, MD, MSc

Professor of Surgery, Harvard Medical School Chief of the Division of Surgical Oncology at Brigham and Women's Hospital Inaugural BWH Distinguished Chair in Surgical Oncology Surgery Director of the Center for Sarcoma and Bone Oncology at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute

**Dr. Chandrajit P. Raut**, is a Professor of Surgery at Harvard Medical School, Chief of the Division of Surgical Oncology at Brigham and Women's Hospital, the inaugural BWH Distinguished Chair in Surgical Oncology, and Surgery Director of the Center for Sarcoma and Bone Oncology at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute. A graduate of Stanford University, University of Oxford, and Harvard Medical School, he completed his general surgery residency at Massachusetts General Hospital and surgical oncology fellowship at M.D. Anderson Cancer Center.

Dr. Raut specializes in the multidisciplinary care of patients with soft tissue sarcoma. He received a multi-PI R01 grant evaluating an innovative drug-eluting film to be placed in the surgical bed to reduce tumor local recurrence rates. He was co-PI on a multi-institutional phase 2 clinic trial evaluating 5 years of adjuvant imatinib for primary GIST, co-investigator on an international phase 3 randomized clinical trial evaluating the use of preoperative radiation therapy for retroperitoneal sarcomas, and a member of the NIH/NCI The Cancer Genome Atlas Sarcoma Working Group. He has authored over 230 papers and over 30 book chapters.

Dr. Raut serves as Section Editor for sarcoma in the journal Cancer, Associate Editor for the journal Sarcoma, and an Editorial Board member for the journal ACS Case Reports in Surgery.

#### CEDARS CANCER FOUNDATION



The Cedars Cancer Foundation at the McGill University Health Centre (MUHC) was established in 1966 originally as the Harley Chamandy Memorial Fund of the Royal Victoria Hospital and later as the Cedars

Cancer Research Fund. A dedicated group from the Lebanese community of Montreal planted the seeds for what is today the Cedars Cancer Foundation.

The original purpose of the organization was, and continues to be, to raise funds for the betterment of cancer care at the MUHC. Cedars' beginnings focused on research and the purchase of state-of- the-art diagnostic and therapeutic equipment. For more than 50 years, efforts have leaned toward patient care and cancer education. A network of psycho-social and humanitarian support for the cancer patients and their families is provided through the Cedars CanSupport program and the Wilfrid Howick Humanitarian Endowment Fund. Cedars' strong commitment to cancer education is demonstrated by the creation of the Henry R. Shibata Fellowship Fund, providing cancer specialists with the opportunity to further their education in order to benefit the hospital, university and, above all, cancer patients.

Thanks to the generosity of loyal donors, Cedars has created seven Annual Visiting Professors in Oncology, which bring world-renowned researchers, educators, and physicians to the McGill teaching hospitals: The Vivian Saykaly Visiting Professor in Medical Oncology, The Edward J. Tabah Visiting Professor in Surgical Oncology, The Dr. Blair N. Whittemore Visiting Professor of Sarah's Fund for Cedars in Pediatric Hematology/ Oncology, The Dr. Sharon Wexler Visiting Professor in Neuro-Oncology, The Tom & Gwen Nacos Visiting Professor in Palliative & Supportive Care, The Florence Flinker Visiting Professor in Colorectal Surgical Oncology, and The Carolyn Freeman Visiting Professor in Radiation Oncology.
